Marriage


Contact the Pastor at least six months prior to the wedding. A preparation course is required.

SUNDAY, JANUARY 15, 2023

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time John the Baptist saw Jesus coming toward him and declared, "Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!" John 1:29

John the Baptist was the first witness of Christ – God had called and prepared him for this.

"John saw something shocking – the beloved Son of God in solidarity with sinners. "Behold the Lamb of God, Who takes away the sin of the world!" (v.29). Let us learn from John the Baptist not to assume that we already know Jesus, that we already know everything about Him (cf. v. 31). This is not so. Let us pause with the Gospel, perhaps even contemplating an icon of Christ, a "Holy face". Let us contemplate with our eyes and yet more with our hearts; and let us allow ourselves to be instructed by the Holy Spirit, Who tells us inside: It is He! He is the Son of God made lamb, immolated out of love. He alone has brought, He alone has suffered, He alone has atoned for sin, the sin of each one of us, the sin of the world, and also my sins. All of them. He brought them all upon Himself and took them away from us, so that we would finally be free, no longer slaves to evil. Yes, we are still poor sinners, but not slaves, no, not slaves: children, children of God!" Jan.19,2020

"May the Virgin Mary obtain for us the strength to bear witness to her Son Jesus; to proclaim Him with joy with a life freed from evil and a word full of astonished and grateful faith."





Prayer for Christian Unity - January 18 - 25, 2023

This universal week of prayer encourages Christians of all denominations to meet, particpiate in a variety of liturgical and other community activities, while also praying together that, "all may be one", as Christ desires.

Pope Francis has invited all to participate in this Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. The theme, "Do good; seek justice", was chosen by the Minnesota Council of Churches (USA) based on Isaiah 1:12-17 and calls all Christians to recognise that the divisions between our churches cannot be separated from the divisions within the wider human family.

The Pope said that in a similar way, Christians of diverse backgrounds and traditions "are pilgrims on our way to full unity" who come closer to our goal when keeping our gaze fixed on Jesus.

The Pope has also encouraged us to offer up our struggles and suffering during this week of prayer.


