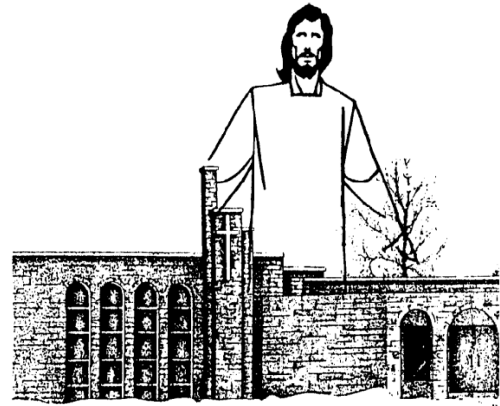

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time



“John the Baptist saw Jesus coming toward him and declared, ‘Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!’” John 1:29

John the Baptist was the first witness of Christ.

“The Baptist cannot hold back the urgent desire to bear witness to Jesus and declares: “I have seen and have borne witness” (v. 34).

This declaration, this witness, reveals John’s spirit of service. With this spirit of service and with his capacity to give way to Jesus, John the Baptist teaches us an important thing. He teaches us the importance of freedom from attachments. It is easy to become attached to roles and positions and to the need to be esteemed, recognized and rewarded. This, although natural, is not a good thing, because service involves gratuitousness - taking care of others without benefit for oneself, without ulterior motives, without expecting something in return.

Are we capable of making space for others? Of listening to them? Of leaving them free and not binding them to ourselves, demanding recognition? Are we capable of letting them speak, at times?

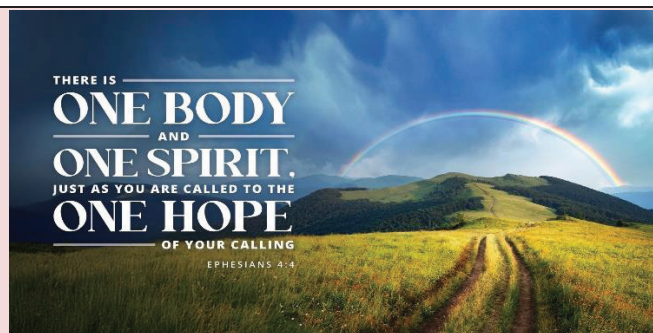

Prayer for Christian Unity

– January 18 - 25, 2026

Based on the Letter to the Ephesians (Eph 4:4), the prayers and reflections of this year's WPCU draws on materials from centuries-old traditions of prayer used by the Armenian people, along with hymns that originated in the ancient monasteries and churches of Armenia, some of which date as far back as the fourth century.

The week focuses on "one hope" - emphasizing shared heritage, service, and spiritual renewal, encouraging prayer for unity and peace, especially for war-torn areas, following Pope Leo XIV's calls for compassion and shared spiritual journey in 2026.

2025 Theme: "The word of

Christ dwells among you" (Col 3:16).

Pope Francis instituted the Sunday of the Word of God on the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time in his Apostolic Letter *Aperuit illis* in 2019. "Devoting a specific Sunday of the liturgical year to the word of God can enable the Church to experience anew how the risen Lord opens up for us the treasury of His word and enables us to proclaim its fathomable riches before the world." This year it will be celebrated in St Peter's Basilica in the presence of Pope Leo leading Vespers at St. Paul Outside the Walls on Sunday 25 January 2026 - also marking the end of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity.
