The Holy Family

“Why were you searching for Me? Did you not know that I must be in My Father’s house?.”
Luke 2:49

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family of Nazareth - a humble and simple family.

“Mary, Joseph and Jesus are united by an immense love and inspired by great trust in God.

The anxiety that they experienced in the three days that Jesus was missing should also be our anxiety when we are distant from Him - when we are distant from Jesus. We should feel anxious when we forget Jesus for more than three days, without praying, without reading the Gospel, without feeling the need of His presence and of His comforting friendship.

Mary and Joseph searched for Him and found Him in the temple while He was teaching. For us too, it is especially in the house of God that we are able to encounter the divine Teacher and receive His message of salvation. In the Eucharistic celebration we have a living experience of Christ; He speaks to us; He offers us His Word; He illuminates us, lights our path, gives us His Body in the Eucharist from which we draw vigour to face everyday difficulties.

Let us ask ourselves: Do I feel anxious when I am distant from Jesus?” Dec.30, 2018

“Let us pray for all the families in the world, especially those in which, for various reasons, peace and harmony are lacking. And let us entrust them to the protection of the Holy Family of Nazareth.”

The Jubilee Year 2025 – a Holy Year of Hope!

The last ordinary holy year, the Great Jubilee Year of 2000, which took place under John Paul II, was one of the biggest events in the history of mankind. The Holy Father Francis has asked that the coming Jubilee Year 2025 to be



lived as a "year of hope. The jubilee year has become a Catholic tradition. It was originally intended to be celebrated every one hundred years; in 1343 Pope Clement VI reduced the gap between Jubilees to every 50 years. The rule to celebrate it every 25 years was established with the Holy Year of 1470 under Pope Paul II. Those who participate in a Holy Year pilgrimage are granted a plenary indulgence; those who are unable to attend in person for concrete reasons are invited to participate spiritually, "offering up the sufferings of their daily lives, and participating in the Eucharistic celebration."
